 5 the 2022-2023 budget.
 6 FINANCE OFFICER LANNING: Hi,
 7 I'm Terry Lanning, Chair for the Finance Commission.
 8 The CP audit for the audit ending July
 9 31, 2021 showed a surplus of \$277,577.
 10 We received from LIT \$122,299.83, which
 11 included a special distribution of \$66,113. And that
 12 special distribution we only get like every four
 13 years. That's why it's so high.
 14 Department car mileage. Lowry has
 15 130,000 on her car, Gary Grigsby, Former Department
 16 Commander, has 155,000, and Rose had 170,000 on their
 17 vehicles.
 18 Finance Commission policy was to
 19 generally keep the vehicles for 150,000 before being
 20 traded in. It was decided to keep the van for the
 21 Senior Vice Commander until it starts to have a
 22 significant amount of repairs.
 23 At that point, we will sell the van and
 24 not buy another van for the Senior Vice Commander.
 25 The Commander Van is good mechanically, so we'll keep

 2 Commander requested a 25 percent increase
 3 in travel budgets, and the Adjutant requested a 20
 4 percent increase. The Commander stated his gas cost
 5 for the last two years have significantly increased.
 6 Decided to raise the per diem from \$40 per day to \$50
 7 per day, and increase mileage reimbursement from 40
 8 cents a mile to 50 cents a mile.
 9 Now this won't go effective till August
 10 1, 2022.
 11 IRS allows a mileage reimbursement of 58
 12 cents from 5, but I think it's gone up to 62. This
 13 increased travel budgets by 20 percent. The cost for
 14 that increase is \$11,728.
 15 The proposed budget for 2022-2023 was
 16 printed in "The Legionnaire." The budget shows a
 17 surplus of \$30,326. Some of the main differences from
 18 this year's printed budget and last year's budget are
 19 as follows:
 20 1. Dropped membership dues 10 percent.
 21 Membership dropped \$22,312 (sic).
 22 2. Decreased the LIT Insurance revenue
 23 \$10,396.
 24 3. Gave all the employees a 5 percent
 25 raise.

1 4. Increased grant money \$70,636.
 2 5. The PPP money, which was for COVID
 3 from the government we no longer received, and that
 4 was \$70,070.
 5 6. Increased conference and convention
 6 \$4,500.
 7 7. Increased headquarters and VA&R
 8 Health Insurance \$5,614.
 9 8. Increased Missouri Legionnaire
 10 \$8,325. for two issues to be mailed out.
 11 9. Increased tax on unrelated business
 12 income, \$18,280.
 13 10. The total revenue decreased
 14 \$42,382.
 15 11. Total expenses increased \$50,157.
 16 12. This decreased the budget surplus by
 17 \$92,539 over last year.
 18 That's my report. Motion to approve it.


